Thank you to the members who participated and shared their knowledge and experience. We look forward to more of these sessions.

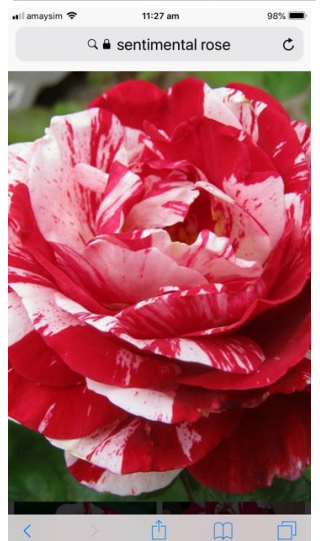

## Recipe for Passionfruit Slice

*By popular demand from members who sampled the fine cakes and biscuits brought along to the meeting, here is Sharon & Kay's recipe for:*

### Passionfruit Slice

180°C oven

- Combine 1 cup S/R flour, 1 cup desiccated coconut and ½ cup caster sugar in bowl.
- Stir in 125g melted butter. Mix well. Press evenly into base of 18 x 28cm slice pan greased and lined.
- Bake for 15mins until lightly browned.
- Meanwhile combine 395g can condensed milk, ½ cup fresh lemon juice and 1/3 cup passionfruit pulp in bowl. Beat with wooden spoon until smooth.
- Pour passionfruit mixture over hot base.
- Bake for further 15mins or until just set.
- Cool in pan before slicing.

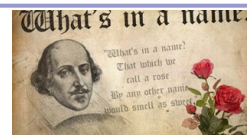

## What's In A Name:



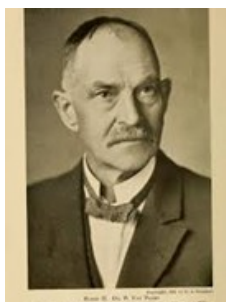
Dr Van Fleet

### Dr Van Fleet

Climber, Walter Van Fleet (USA) 1910; Medium-sized pale-pink flowers borne in late spring on a very strong climbing plant. Excellent fragrance.

When he was 18, Walter Van Fleet (1857-1922) the son of a country schoolmaster, ran away from home to work for a railway company in Brazil in the hope of studying the flowers of the Amazon. He was given little chance to do that and yellow fever nearly deprived America of its first internationally famous rose breeder.

On his return home he married his childhood sweetheart, Sarah Heilman, and became a doctor. But he had always wanted to breed plants, so in 1891 he forsook medicine and joined the US Department of Agriculture. For them he bred gladioli, strawberries, raspberries, and blight-resistant chestnuts; but roses were his great love. He sought 'dooryard roses' which would flourish with little care anywhere, and of the many he raised "Van Fleet" is his masterpiece. (He wanted to call it "Daybreak" but was overruled). Then in 1930 a nurseryman in Connecticut noticed one his plants of 'Dr Van Fleet' was flowering all season. It was propagated and introduced as "New Dawn". Less vigorous than its parent. 'New Dawn' is one of the world's favourite roses, but don't forget 'Dr Van Fleet'. If you want to slipcover the garage with roses, it would be the perfect choice.

## Rose Care Calender: Tips for August

The latter half of August is ideal for feeding roses, though in cold areas this can be delayed until September. If a few early aphids are seen they should be dealt with, for they breed at a tremendous rate. A few shoots of Hybrid Tea roses will be ready for disbudding in order to improve the quality of the flowers.

## Did you know that:

### Rose Trial Gardens

.. exist throughout the world. At least 25 are acknowledged by the World Federation of Rose Societies. In Australia, the Trial Garden was established in 1996 to independently trial roses not yet commercially released, bred locally or internationally.

The National Rose Trial Garden of Australia was initially established to simply trial roses not yet commercially released in Australia - be they bred in Australia or overseas.

This charter remains today and incorporates the following:

1. To identify and promote those roses best suited to Australian growing conditions.
2. To develop and promote Australian Rose Breeding.
3. To provide general information on roses to the public.

To provide feedback to rose breeders, growers and retailers as to those roses judged by the public to be the most popular.

Plants are assessed on General Impression, Flower, Disease Resistance, and Fragrance.
