

### What's In A Name







Hybrid Tea Rose Peter Frankenfeld is probably one of the very best dark pink varieties Hybrid Tea roses. It provides a colourful display from late spring to late autumn. Hybrid Tea roses are hardy, vigorous, long (repeat) flowering and disease resistant making them ideal plants to have.

**Peter Frankenfeld** was a German comedian, radio and television personality.

After *World War II* he became an interpreter with the U.S. military government. In 1948 he went into broadcasting. He <u>pioneered</u> quiz programs on West German radio and television, becoming the country's best-known programme host and entertainer. In 1962, he and director Heinz Dunkhase discovered the comedy sketch "Dinner for One" in Blackpool which was staged in Frankenfeld's live show shortly thereafter, and recorded on 8 July 1963. The show was re-run occasionally on German television until it got its fixed spot on New Year's Eve in 1972.

## Rose Care Calender: Tips for June

Before planting bare root roses soak the plants in a bucket of water with seaweed solution for at least two hours. Make a mound in the hole and place the roots over and down around the mound. The bud union needs to be facing north or west and sitting 3-5cm above ground level. Backfill the soil halfway up the hole. Water well, poking around the roots to maintain soil and root contact. Let this drain for 15-20 minutes, then back fill to soil level and water lightly. This will minimise air pockets. Do not use fertiliser in the planting hole as this will likely burn the new roots that develop. We recommend using Neutrog's Seamungus in June and July as it is an excellent soil conditioner, gentle acting, and it will help plants settle in and get growing new roots and shoots ready for spring.

## Did you know that

A **rose** is a woody perennial flowering plant of the genus **Rosa**, in the family Rosaceae, or the flower it bears. There are over three hundred species and thousands of cultivars. They form a group of plants that can be erect shrubs, climbing, or trailing, with stems that are often armed with sharp prickles. Flowers vary in size and shape and are usually large and showy, in colours ranging from white through yellows and reds. Most species are native to Asia, with smaller numbers native to Europe, North America, and northwestern Africa. Species, cultivars and hybrids are all widely grown for their beauty and often are fragrant. Roses have acquired cultural significance in many societies. Rose plants range in size from compact, miniature roses, to climbers that can reach seven meters in height. Different species hybridize easily, and this has been used in the development of the wide range of garden roses.

The name rose comes from French, itself from Latin rosa, which was perhaps borrowed from Oscan, from Greek ρόδον rhódon (Aeolic βρόδον wródon), itself borrowed from Old Persian wrd- (wurdi), related to Avestan varəδa, Sogdian ward, Parthian wâr.


