Cultural Notes

The Royal Easter Show is nearly upon us and those who are entering have already pruned their roses so that pivot days may be attained for blooms. This would have been done sometime in February. So wishing all well.

You can continue to dead head and remove spindly stems and growth from you plants. This will assist when it comes to pruning tiem. With all the rain around disease e.g. blackspot will spawn and to keep your roses in good condition a spray program 10 to 14 days should keep them clean.

If you go down to the East Coast Rose Trial Garden in front of the Brother's cottages at Winbourne you can see how WhoFlungDung has kept the gardens reasonbly weed free and the nutrients enabling the plants to grow well and produce many blooms. WhoFlungDung is used as a mulch and the soil in the gardens have been improving

Fertilizer can be applied so that the roses can produce blooms for later in Autumn or a particular date in your garden. As the nights get cooler, the blooms take longer to develop thus larger flowers.

The new product of Neutrog - Chocablock is now available for purchase on the website. I am planning to use it in the trial gardens as it has soil improvement bacteria and micro-organisms

The nurseries now have their online catalogues out and you are able to purchase some bareroot roses for a winter delivery. You can also prepare your new beds for planting. Good soil preparation helps to grow roses well over many years.

COMMENTS
