

Tips and Hints for Rose Growing and Cultivating in January

check out these hints for members of UNSH!

In January, rose cultivation in New South Wales (NSW), Australia, requires careful attention to climate and plant health. This time of year falls in the peak of summer, meaning hot temperatures and strong sunlight, which can stress rose plants if not managed properly. To ensure healthy growth and vibrant blooms, regular watering is essential, especially during dry spells. Roses prefer deep watering, but it's important to avoid overhead irrigation to prevent fungal diseases. Fertilizing roses during January supports robust growth. Use a balanced rose fertilizer, but avoid overfeeding, as this can encourage excessive foliage at the expense of flowers. Pruning is typically minimal at this time; however, deadheading spent blooms helps encourage new flower production and maintains the plant's appearance.

Mulching around the base of rose plants is a key practice during the summer months, as it helps conserve soil moisture and regulate temperature. Regularly inspect for pests like aphids and spider mites, which can thrive in the warmer weather. Keeping an eye out for signs of disease and taking action early can prevent larger issues later in the season. Overall, January is a time to maintain, support, and nurture rose plants, setting the stage for a healthy flowering season.

The land the garden resides on was originally bought in 1799 by Scottish immigrants Andrew and Elizabeth McDougall. They named it Roxburgh Place, presumably after Roxburgh County in Scotland.. Today, the garden is considered one of the largest of its kind in Sydney and is home to over 4,000 roses and 80 different species.

April- Eryldene House & Gardens North Shore

Eryldene was the home of scholar and connoisseur Professor E G Waterhouse, and his wife, Janet. House and garden layout were designed by colonial revivalist architect, Hardy Wilson in 1913 and the place is the result of twenty years remarkable collaboration between client and architect.


