Rose Growing in Sydney in March

- In Australia roses typically bloom from spring to autumn, meaning you can expect to see many roses in bloom throughout March,
- 1.
- Blooming Period:
- Sydney has a mild temperate climate, so roses in Sydney generally bloom from October to April, making March a prime time for enjoying their blooms.
- Popular Varieties
 - Floribunda Roses: These are known for their clusters of colorful flowers and long flowering season. Some examples:
 - ☐ Iceberg roses (white), Brass Band (crimson), Henri Matisse (striped red) and Gold Bunny(yellow)
 - **Hybrid Tea roses:** Hybrid tea flowers are usually well-formed with large, high-centred buds, supported by long, straight and upright stems. Their flowers are usually borne singly at the end of long stems. Some examples:

- Aoteoroa (soft pink), Midas touch (yellow), Barrone de Rothschild (Crimson) and Camp David (red)
- Popular colours

2. Crimson Red Roses

- 'Mr. Lincoln': A classic, known for its beautiful perfume.
- 'Papa Meilland': Another classic, with velvety crimson blooms.
- 'Camp David': A sturdy Hybrid Tea rose with bold, rounded red blooms.

White Roses:

- 'Iceberg' Rose: A classic white shrub rose known for its abundant blooms.
- 'Winchester Cathedral': A white English rose variety, known for its fragrant blooms.
- 'Annapurna': A white hybrid tea rose.
- 'Penny Lane': A white climbing rose
- 4. Pink Roses:
- 'Rose Bellevue': A stunning bi-color rose with pink flowers that fade to green closer to the edges.
- 'Just Joey': A pink rose that is a popular choice for Australian gardens.
- 'Camp David': A pink rose that is known for its strong fragrance.
- 'Pascali': A pink rose that is known for its beautiful shape and color
- 'Daybreaker': A Floribunda Rose with pink and apricot blooms, known for its disease resistance.



March - Roxborough Park - Queen Elizabeth Memorial Rose Garden ramble

This event was held on Saturday 15th at the conclusion of our regular meeting. After feasting on a wonderful afternoon tea at Priya's place, we all packed into our cars and headed into Baulkham Hills. The afternoon was particularly hot but armed with umbrellas, hats and sunscreen we braved the elements to enjoy the viewing.

The land the QEII garden resides on was originally bought in 1799 by Scottish immigrants Andrew and Elizabeth McDougall. They named it Roxburgh Place, presumably after Roxburgh County in Scotland.. Today, the garden is considered one of the largest of its kind in Sydney and is home to over 4,000 roses and 80 different species.

Despite the heat the garden was mostly in bloom. Such a wonderful and well tended display! More extensive than the famous Rosarium, in Toowoomba, right in our backyards and something to be proud of.
