Rejuvenation of Rose Gardens

The National Rose Garden in Canberra is under the process of rejuvenation. So, as part of this process, the gardeners accessed information from the National Rose Society of Australia to assist in

the rejuvenation process.

For those new to rose gardening, aside from recommending hardy, disease-resistant roses, the following advice was given by our experts to the National Rose garden trustees. This information was reported on at the recent State Rose Society meeting. This expert advice will benefit UNSH members greatly as we work to establish healthy roses in our own garden beds. While we have excellent product from Neutrog, I believe the following advice may assist us all to know how to use the tools and products more effectively.

"Over many years of observation, it has been seen that where roses have been planted for a long time, the soil develops what is termed 'rose soil sickness' or 'replant disease'. Meaning, new roses planted in the same soil as previous roses do not thrive.

The following are two methods are recommended for addressing this issue and to avoid the need to import new soil. For both methods, start by taking out the old roses and as many roots as possible.

Method 1: Remove about a wheel barrow load of soil from each rose site. Replace with compatible soil, mixed with aged cow manure and/or compost. Apply monthly treatments of beneficial bacteria and microbes e.g.GOGO juice or POPUL8.

Method 2: Leave old soil in place. Mix in Seamungus and organic matter. Plant a cover crop of white mustard in Autumn. Dig into the soil before flowering to treat nematodes. Apply monthly treatments of beneficial bacteria and microbes e.g.GOGO juice or POPUL8.

Method 2 was used successfully by the Adelaide Botanic Gardens over 5 years.".

April-East Coast Rose Trial Garden - Richard and Ruth Walsh

Judy, Scott, Sandy, Priya and Muthu ventured out to see the East Coast Rose Trial garden at Winbourne, 1315 Mulgoa Rd Mulgoa on Saturday 5th April. Set in a hectare of peaceful bushland, Winbourne function centre sits on lands of the Dharuk peoples. Mulgoa means 'black swan' in Dharuk.

The Winbourne retreat has a history dating back to the pioneering Cox family of 1820's. William Cox was a Leutenant in the NSW Corps. He was in charge of constructing the road over the Blue

Mountains. In 1958 the Christian Brothers purchased Winbourne where it was used as a training facility. It is now a function centre and home for retired clergy.

Our members were able to talk to the ECRTG assessors about how the roses were chosen and judged and what characteristics judges are looking for.

They discussed with the managers - Richard and Ruth- about how the beds are prepared and how the roses have been cared for over the two year trial period.

Bed 2- was the Public choice of winners. Our members were present when the winning rose of the competition was announced. No names have been given to the roses as yet.
