You and your Gardening tools - Episode 2

Well here we are again in the depths of a very cold and WET winter, wishing for the return of the sun. Avid gardeners, are never satisfied for long with staying rugged up inside doing "nothing". There is always something constructive that can be done in preparation for the return of the growing season.

Taking care of your gardening tools might not be the most exciting part of gardening, but it sure pays off! Well-maintained tools last longer, work better, and make your gardening life much easier. After each use at the end of the day, give tools a quick clean to remove soil and sticky sap, then dry them off to prevent rust—especially those metal parts. Sharpen blades (like pruners and shears) now and then to keep them clean-cutting. A word of caution - clean your tool first while the blade is dull to avoid cutting yourself! A wipe with an oily rag (sewing machine oil) keeps rust at bay and moving parts smooth.

Don't forget to check wooden handles too—sanding splinters and rubbing in linseed oil helps them stay strong and comfy. Also, check handle attachment screws for rust so that your favourite spade does not fail in the middle of a job. And every once in a while, give everything a deeper clean and inspection—think of it as a spa day for your spades and blades!

With a little regular TLC, your tools will be ready for action every time you hit the garden. So, back by popular request, the perfect job for a cold and wet day - information on tool care from Cut above tools at Seven Hills.

SHARPENING TOOLS

Solution – 70% methylated spirits & 30% water

- 1. Spray blades with either the home-made solution or WD40 foam cleaner
- 2. Clean with metal brush and wipe with clean cloth
- 3. Sharpen blades with sharpening tool
- 4. Oil with Singer Sewing Machine Oil, WD40 or 3-in-one Multi-Purpose Oil
- 5. Clean handles with magic sponge and methylated spirits
- 6. Store in a drawer or in a dry place

Get ready for pruning your beauties in late July once the frost has passed. Happy Gardening!


