


Australian-bred Roses – New Release Stamps





TALK BY RICHARD WALSH:

The Rose Trial Garden

- Richard began his talk with the offer of back copies of American Rose
 - Society Magazine.
- A rose trial garden is a garden set up for Rose breeders to test roses.
- They operate like a rose show for breeders, providing awards,
- Publicity and assessment
- The first trial garden was set up in Adelaide in 1990s
- **♣ Do we need them?** yes, but how have their results made an impact?
 - o (Gold Medals for NRTGA Heaven on Earth, Afrikaans, Delightful Parfuma,
 - Jessika's Rose, Black Forest Rose, Olivia Rose Austin, Lady of Australia,
 - Golden Beauty, Bordeaux, Eye Shadow). Richard discussed that little is known
 - of these roses by most people.
- What are they all about?
 - preparation and maintenance
 - assessment
 - application and promotion
- Criteria:
- Perfume
- *Disease Resistance
- *Quality flowers
- *Repeat flowering
- ♣ Richard and Ruth breed roses without perfume and that are suitable for the bench. They feel that perfume is a distraction as there is too much focus by breeders on this rather than the quality of the bloom. In roses with strong perfume the bloom itself doesn't last as long in the vase and they tend to burn on a hot day. This is due to the presence and developing of ethylene in the rose bloom.
- Fragrance is worth 10% in the Adelaide Trial Garden. This is too high a percentage in the acceptance and recommendation of roses.
- Assessment criteria what would members see as mandatory/desirable
 NRTGA WFRS system
- General Impression 30 points Plant, Foliage, Vigour, Flowering, Novelty
- Flower 30 points Blooms, Buds, Colour, Abundance of Flowering, Recurrent Bloom, Post Flowering, Novelty
- Disease Resistance 30 points Fungal Diseases, Pest Tolerance
- Fragrance 10 points
- ♣ The Adelaide Trial gardens test roses that grow well in Adelaide with their dryer climate and alkaline soils.
- They test the roses by growing them for 2 years before being assessed for sale.
- It costs \$160.00 to submit a rose.
- A rose trial garden was established in Mulgoa to simulate a NSW garden and growing conditions. (ECRTG-East Coast Rose Trial Garden)
- Objectives for (NRSA and) ECRTG
- Assess and promote those roses best suited growing conditions on the East Coast.
- 1. Develop and promote Australian Rose Breeding.
- 2. Provide general information on roses to the public.

ECRTG – same as Toowoomba (almost)

Growth and vigour – 10 points
Foliage cover – 10 points
Disease resistance – 10 points
Heat tolerance – 10 points
Flowering ability – 10 points
Wow factor – 10 points

Total out of 60 converted to a percentage ECRTG based on Toowoomba with added

Wow factor

The garden is at the Edmund Rice Centre with the great rose enthusiast Brother Jeff as the contact. It is 11metres x 1metre.

Everyone is invited to the Official Opening on **Saturday 12**th **November**. You will need to bring your own chair. The Rose Garden is inviting International Growers to submit roses.
