Come to the show prepared and give yourself plenty of time to exhibit your roses.


And enjoy the experience!

# **Open Class Champion:**

- A. Class Exhibition rose
  - 1. One stem exhibition rose.
  - 2. Vase, 3 stems same cultivar
  - 3. 4 stages Bud to Bloom.
- B. Floribunda Roses
  - 4. One cut or stem
  - 5. Vase, 3 cuts or stem same cultivar.

#### **Miniature Champion:**

- 6. One stem miniature rose exhibition form
- 7. One vase, 3 miniature roses same cultivar
- 8. One vase, 4 miniature roses same cultivar Bud to Bloom
- 9. One miniflora rose exhibition form.
- 10. One vase, 3 miniflora roses same cultivar
- 11. One vase, 4 miniflora roses same cultivar Bud to Bloom

#### **Novice Champion:**

- 12. One Exhibition Rose
- 13. One vase, 3 stems same cultivar hybrid tea or floribunda rose.
- 14. One miniature or miniflora rose
- 15. 3 stems or cuts miniature or miniflora rose same cultivar.

#### **Floral Art Champion**

- 1. Christmas Theme Rose bowl at least 6 roses using other foliage or flowers.
- 2. Vertical arrangement.

Floral art can be pre-prepared using own vases and material.
