Fortnightly Profile – June 2020

As Covid restrictions have begun to be lifted we held a pruning demonstration and working bee at the home of Dorothy Sneddon. Pruning encourages new growth and continued blooming as well as helping to shape the plant. Remove any branches thinner than a pencil, as well as any dead or diseased wood. Prune to open the center of the plant to light and air. This helps reduce disease. At the end of your pruning, spray with lime sulphur with a ratio of 1:10. It is a stronger strength that is only used at pruning time. First remove any leaves and dispose of any pruned branches, then spray the plants and ground around them.
