It will be a chance to see some summer pruning demonstrated, preparing a garden to bloom in time for a special occasion, and also to learn what you don't do in a rose garden — as I have plenty of examples to show you. I'll put a map and some instructions further into the newsletter. AS WE ARE RESTRICTED TO 30 IT WILL BE NECESSARY TO LEAVE A MESSAGE EITHER ON THE PHONE OR BY EMAIL IF YOU ARE COMING. I'VE ABOUT 11 SO FAR HAVE CONFIRMED.

# In your garden this month...

ORDER NEW ROSES: If there are some special roses you are wanting – now is the time to look up the catalogues and get your order in. There are some excellent rose nurseries such as Treloar, Wagner's Roses, Green E, Swanes and others you will find on the NSW Rose web site where you can order your bare root rose for planting in June/July. Don't forget that Wagner's has a 10% discount for Rose Society members. Code: 100%ROSES!

**DEADHEADING YOUR ROSES:** By <u>removing the old blooms</u> it eliminates the energy being channelled into producing rosehip and instead encourages new roses to bloom.

Just deadhead the rose plants about 10-15 cm down the stems and shape the rose back to a nice balanced plant.



**SUMMER PRUNE**: By the end of February our roses have grown exponentially

especially this year because of the rain. They will have become tall and straggly and will need to be cut back at least by a third to have that final

autumn flush of roses. (you will see how straggly my roses are at Kanahooka- and time to prune for a bloom in April).

After the prune, give your garden some nourishment of Seamungus, Sudden Impact for Roses and some manure/ compost to get the rose bushes ready for the big Autumn flush of blooms.



rain. It's also important to look out for **scale** as well because it will begin to show in the damp around the base of the rose bush. So when the weather allows

spray with a fungicide and then a periodic spray with GoGo Juice and Eco Seaweed will strengthen the foliage.

Watch out for your **potted roses** as well, because with all the rain there is a leeching out of nutrients and they will need some attention with fertilizer. (*Strike Back for Orchids*, or liquid *Sudden Impact* plus liquid *Seamungus* are excellent for nourishing those roots)

This means all ordering and payments will be online to Neutrog direct.

All of the past benefits, such as the quality fertilisers and substantial benefits will continue with added assistance to support this transition.

- ► The previous handling fee of 10% (approx) that Regionals charge, will be rebated back to our group and paid directly into our Regional accounts.
- ► As an incentive and thank you for giving the online store a go and supporting Neutrog, Illawarra members will receive a **\$20** credit in store to apply to their first order.
- ► Members will have access to a limited quantity of further **discounted Who Flung Dung seconds** (the packaging is seconds not the material). This will come on a first-in-bestdressed basis.
- ► Hardware Man at Unanderra, through the generosity of Hans van de Haar will be the collection point as it was last time. Laurie Irvine will audit the delivery but HELP IS NEEDED ON DELIVERY DAY TO SORT INTO INDIVIDUAL BUNDLES FOR COLLECTION. PLEASE LET US KNOW IF YOU ARE ABLE TO ASSIST FOR A COUPLE OF HOURS. - ▶ pick up will be available over a period of a week. If problem with picking up <u>special arrangements could be made</u> if necessary.

#### THE ORDERING PROCESS


- 1. Our Regional sends a spreadsheet to Neutrog with details of your First and Last names, Phone Number and Email Address. We seek your permission to do this an email will be sent soon requesting this permission.
- 2. Once permission is given, Neutrog will then create an individual online account for you. An email notification will advise you of this account set up.
- 3. If you require assistance to set up your account Neutrog are happy to help you.
- 4. You will then receive an email, which will include an activation button for your account.
- 5. Once activated you will see the full range of Neutrog products for order placement. 6. When you complete the order it will tell you how to pay.

Robert Coady (Treasurer) has agreed to be a contact for those who may have problems with this ordering process.

Once your account is set up you will be able to order online as you run out of products and then the order will be delivered on the Regional delivery date. WE HOPE TO HAVE THIS UNDERWAY TO ENABLE AN ORDER TO REACH US BY THE END OF MARCH. YOU WILL BE NOTIFIED OF THE DELIVERY DATE WHEN ALL IS ORGANISED.
