Saturday 19th February 2022 - Meet Glennis Clark, Heritage Rose grower and Rookwood volunteer. "Among the hidden treasures at Rookwood Necropolis are beautiful old roses, cared for by volunteers. 99% were propagated from cuttings taken from roses growing on graves. Grave sites were being cleared and herbicides were being used around graves so the idea was to save the roses. Cuttings were taken and the plants that were propagated were grown on in the nursery. About three-quarters of them have been identified. The others are 'found roses', named after the graves they were growing on, such as 'Agnes Smith'. As well as Barbara's Garden, there are old roses such as 'Albertine', 'Crepuscule' and 'Monsieur Tillier', growing around and over graves in the old Anglican section. There's a serpentine canal built in the 1880s winding through it, and other Victorian garden features, as well as some grand old trees".

Saturday 19th March - Dunc's Honey a local Beekeeper from Menai will give a hands on approach to Beekeeping. Did you know almonds, apples, avocadoes, blueberries, cucumbers, pumpkins, and rockmelons all depend 100 per cent on honey bee pollination services? Honey will change in taste, colour and consistency as the seasons change. Product available for purchase.
