#### Tips and Hints for Rose Growing and Cultivating in October/November

In Australia, October and November mark the transition from spring to early summer, which is a crucial time for rose care. Here are three tips for growing and cultivating roses during this period:

#### 1. Pruning and Deadheading

As roses come into full bloom, remove spent flowers (deadheading) to encourage more blooms. This is especially important in spring and early summer as it helps maintain plant health and appearance.

How: Use clean, sharp pruning shears to cut back faded flowers just above the first five-leaflet set. Also, prune any dead, diseased, or damaged growth to promote airflow and overall vitality.

#### 2. Fertilising

Roses are heavy feeders, and in October and November, they are actively growing and blooming. Fertilising helps support their vigorous growth and increases flower production.

How: Apply a balanced rose fertilizer or a slow-release organic option, ensuring it's high in potassium and phosphorus to promote strong stems and abundant flowers. Sudden Impact for roses is a good option.

Always follow package instructions for the correct dosage and timing.

#### 3. Watering and Mulching

As the weather warms up, roses need consistent moisture, especially during dry spells, to thrive and avoid stress.

How: Water deeply but infrequently to encourage strong root development. Mulching with organic materials like wood chips or compost helps retain soil moisture, regulates temperature, and reduces weeds. Whoflungdung is a good option.

These general tips will help ensure your roses stay healthy and vibrant during the active growing season in Australia's spring and early summer.

#### **NOVEMBER BENCHING SCHEDULE**

#### **CLASS 1 ONE EXHIBITION ROSE**

CLASS 2 ONE VASE BUNCH ROSES These must be in a semi open form (not bud, not exhibition or open blooms). HT roses only.

CLASS 3 VASE MINIATURES OR MINIFLORAS 1-3 STEMS (same cultivar)

CLASS 4 ONE ROSE IN YOUR OWN BOWL - may add a small amount of foliage of your choosing. Make sure that the rose is in proportion to your bowl.

CLASS 5 PORTRAIT OF A ROSE - This is a new class.

We will provide 6 acrylic single rose vases to be used for this class. You can use any rose i.e. exhibition, floribunda, shrub etc. except mini or miniflora. Use some rose foliage. Only available to the first 6 exhibitors & in this format only. You can reserve your "vase" by emailing or phoning Judy or collect on the day if any still available.

CLASS 6 FLORAL ART - STICKS & STONES Must be predominantly roses
