Following the very exciting introduction of the New <u>2024 Benching Schedule Guidelines</u> at the February Meeting the UNSH Executive Committee would like to offer an <u>Amendment to New Benching Schedule</u> in consideration of fostering inclusive practices for all UNSHkins.

Proxy Benching Authority


UNSH values the contribution and participation of all members at benching. UNSH recognizes that physical restrictions/barriers can impact an individual's capacity to bench independently.

An **individual UNSH member that is impacted by physical restrictions/impairments** (both acute short-term AND chronic long-term conditions) may submit entries **via proxy** to UNSH monthly benching provided:

- the **blooms have been under the ownership and care** of the physically restricted/impaired UNSH member for a **3 month minimum**
- the entries have been prepared for benching by the physically restricted/impaired UNSH member
- The proxy submitting entries MUST be an UNSH member.
- entries via proxy must be clearly identified at time of Benching on Benching sign in sheet.
- email notification is sent to the UNSH secretary (prior to meeting) identifying the proxy submission

Please Note: It is the **responsibility of the individual** physically restricted/impaired UNSH member to arrange a proxy person to transport and submit the entries. Individuals with **chronic** (long-term) physical restriction/impairment need to nominate proxy benching authority to **UNSH secretary ONCE only.**

This proxy arrangement is proposed to take effect for the March UNSH meeting. The March Agenda will allow further discussion, with an opportunity for members to provide feedback, before formally adopting the amendment and schedule.

We were delighted to welcome Mark Massey of Mother Earth Nurseries as our guest speaker in February. Mark has a contagious plant and rosey-enthusiasm energy, alongside an encyclopedic knowledge, that no doubt contribute to the booming success of his nurseries. It was certainly a treat to hear him share his wealth of experience! He spoke about his particular passion for sourcing and reintroducing unusual/ hard to come by resilient and hardy species of yesteryear gardens back to Sydneysiders. There was certainly a rush for the goodies he brought along on the day.





Mark provided a demonstration of "Nursery pruning of Potted Roses" which involved cutback to 10cm above graft point. He noted that dieback will occur to node and then halt. He discussed the importance of clean secateurs for this process - discussing methods to clean 'on the go' in between plants. He encouraged this pruning method as perfect for late Summer, as it leads to vigorous growth and a fantastic late Autumnal flush for Roses - to maximise our blooming season.



Mark talked about the importance of POST CUT CARE: fertilizing FIRST and then generously mulching. He explained the rationale for this is to ensure that the Nitrogen component in fertilizer is not lost on oxidation with atmospheric contact – essentially trapping the nitrogen in the layers and allowing penetration to the soil. Additionally, it ensures that the fertilizer is buffered against extreme temperature variation that cause 'fertilizer dumping' on high temp days.



Mark discussed the 'notching' principle of using the secateur tip and 'tapping' the graft point and surround above graft growth – he discussed this mimics 'nibbling in nature' and results in vigorous water shoot regrowth from the 'tapped points'. He cautioned against 'notching' root stock as it will stimulate undesired growth.







