GUEST SPEAKER JUDY SATCHELL



Our speaker this month was Judy Satchell on Placing Roses in an Arrangement for Benching.

Judy Firstly demonstrated arranging a bowl.

- Minimum of 10 blooms-can be more.
- This is the simplest form so therefore there is no foliage.
- Not a standard unit but will be found in a rose show. The arrangement is not eligible for Championships.
- The arrangement must be as tall as wide. Preferably wider than the height.
- Prepare with a 1 cm gap between stems as the rose will continue to open-up. The blooms must not be touching and must be individually spaced and even and size.
- The main point for judging is the decorative effect of the unit. They will look for Condition-3pts.



- Stem and foliage-2pts
- Presentation-2pts.
- You can have foliage and buy roses. It is best to have one colour.
- You will be required to pre-do your arrangement of the unit for the Nepean Show, but for the Easter show you arrange on site.
- Judy also showed us how to create a table runner.
- She used ivy; viburnum; silver wattle; wattle blooms; sasanqua Camelias stems; wind anemones; plectranthus eckonilii; yarrow; pom-pom Chrysanthemum; Camelias with buds; roses and buds.
- You need to cover all the oasis evenly and with similar sized blooms.
- You need an odd number of rose blooms and use rose buds for added depth.

SANDY'S MUM'S SPONGE CAKE!

5 Large eggs separated (if the eggs are small use 6 eggs there is no need to increase the other ingredients) Large duck eggs are even better!

142 grams of white sugar

14gms of plain flour

128 grams of Cornflour

Separate all eggs.

Beat egg whites until stiff and peaks form.

Beat in 1 tablespoon of Sugar and one of egg yolks, until the sugar has dissolved and then keep adding in same ratios until all has been used and mixture is smooth, and sugar dissolved.

Sift in the dry ingredients and then FOLD in carefully until the flour is combined with the egg and not pockets of dry flour exist.

Line the sides and bottom of a Springform tin about 20 CMS diameter, the small/wider the tin, the higher/lower the height of the Sponge when cooked.

Bake at 170 – 180 deg in fan forced oven, if you know your oven runs hot then drop temp and bake for at least 30 minutes without opening the oven door. Test with a cake needle in the centre if it comes out clean then remove from oven, remove paper lining and let cool completely on rack.

If you want to make it a chocolate one, for every tablespoon of (good) cocoa powder put in, take out the same in the cornflour.

Dress as desired.

It's a wonderful recipe and is always a winner.

MAY IN THE ROSE GARDEN:



-Prepare the soil for planting in June/July. Use dolomite on acid soils and iron sulphate or gypsum on alkaline soils. If you are replacing a rose dig out a wheelbarrow load of the soil and replace with soil from another part of the garden where no roses have been growing. Dig in well-rotted manure and organic matter. Continue spraying with Eco Oil and Neem Oil if you notice aphids.

Rose Ordering:

Have you ordered any new roses?

Did you take into account Climate Change in your choices?

Growing roses in a semi-tropical environment with high humidity causes more fungal diseases and stress on the plant.

There are recommendations from both Treloar's and the Queensland Rose Society for plants that cope with higher heat and humidity. Many breeders are breeding roses with high disease resistance and more reliable flowering.
