## Special Notes for Exhibitors - Please Read and Familiarize Yourself

1. For newer exhibitors it would be appreciated if you can please read the schedule and supporting notes carefully.
2. A member who has not won a prize at a Regional Show is classed as a Novice. Classes 44 to 53 fall into this category. Therefore all other exhibitors are classed as $\mathrm{A}, \mathrm{B}$ or C graders.
3. When arriving at the venue please pick up your show requirements from the Show Secretary.
4. Any concerns please speak with the Show Manager - Doug Hayne or Assistant Show Manager - Richard Walsh
5. Exhibitors please note that all Standard Units regardless of classification is eligible for Champion Ribbon unless stated that they are not- e.g. All winners of their class compete for the champion ribbon as well as those identified in the championship units.
6. Floribunda Roses/Grandiflora Roses please see Supporting Notes No's 15 and 16 - important.
7. An Exhibition HT is a rose with multiple petals, a pointed center and not fully open - e.g. Kardinal. Roses registered as HT 's e.g. Alister Clark roses do not fall into this class as they do not have exhibition form.
8. Please use the vases allocated to the classes for uniformity.
9. Should you require more space or need to move an exhibit please call the Show Manager/Assistant Show Manager/Chief Steward to assist.
10. Do not spray your flowers on the bench.
11. The room is carpeted so please do not overfill your vases with water.
12. Please note, all Australian Bred Rose Units are to be marked with a sticker in all classes including Championships, if not printed on the rose name card.
13. Roses in Classes 5ABC, 33ABC AUS - 38ABC AU, do not require stickers.
14. Units consisting of up to 1-6 stems and/or cuts are to have coloured sticker attached. On these stickers exhibitors are requested to write 'F' indicating Floribunda, 'D' for Decorative, 'S' for Shrub and ' G ' for Grandiflora to assist judge when determining Champion Units of those exhibits.
15. Stickers will be supplied on request from the Show Secretary.
16. To ensure continuity rose names need to be on a printed card.
17. Attached is a list of the rose names and their Modern Roses Classification on file.
18. The names will be found hanging on a rail in alphabetical order. Please see Chief Steward.
19. If you have a rose/s not on file please send us the names prior to the show and we will endeavor to have them available on the day of the show.
20. All units to be on the show bench by 10.00 am for 10.15 am judging.
21. The club opens at 10.00 am with lunch available for patrons from 12 pm until 8 pm .

## Notes Supporting the Schedule

1. Australian Bred Roses: are to be marked with a sticker unless name card has one on it.
2. Cultivars: Where there is more than one stem or cut to a vase, they shall be of the same cultivar unless otherwise stated in the Schedule. All cultivars should be named.
3. Bowls: Bowls will be provided by Society. Refer to copy of Show Regulations (included)
4. Stem: Original new growth which carries a single bloom or bud and has received no check from pinching, stopping, or pruning from the time of starting into growth to flowering. Disbudding is not regarded as a check to growth under this definition. The stem should be proportionate in thickness and length to the size of the bloom it supports.
5. Cut: A cut is a stem that carries more than one bloom and/or bud or buds.
6. Bloom: A bud is considered a bloom when one or more of the petals has started to unfurl.
7. Same Cultivar: All stems are to be of the same rose variety.
8. Distinct: To be of a different Cultivar.
9. N.N.D.: Not necessarily distinct, i.e. a combination of cultivars may be used - e.g. two or more of the same can be use or they can all be different
10. Floral Foam: Can be used in all containers but must not extend past the top of the container. If used, it will be at the exhibitor's own expense. Foam should be in line with the end of the vase and stems should be able to be counted by the judges.
11. Exhibition Roses: See copy of Show Regulations (included) - Single flowered roses are not exhibition roses even though they are classed as Hybrid Tea. Usually shown as Decorative Roses.
12. Bunch Roses (Large flowered hybrid tea): Roses are to be shown in single stems to the specified number per vase. A vase should have good length of stem and good foliage, blooms should be uniform in size and at an even stage of development usually half open.
13. Modern Decorative Roses: Any number of buds or blooms per cut or stem is allowed. Blooms or buds may be at any stage of development. This class also includes Single Roses, i.e a rose which consists of 4 to 8 petals e.g., Altissimo, Pink Angel
14. Miniature Roses: Units displaying all stages of development are preferred, unless otherwise stated in the class. Exhibition, Bunch, Bud to Full Bloom, and Full Bloom classes will be judged in accordance with the requirement of the corresponding class of the traditional large roses.
15. Floribunda Roses: in this Schedule, only roses that have been registered as Floribunda Roses are to be shown in Classes 11AB, 30C, 35ABC/AUS.
16. Grandiflora Roses: in this Schedule, only roses registered as Grandiflora are to be shown in classes 22ABC, 23ABC, 24ABC, 36ABC/AUS.
17. Full Bloom Roses: Full bloom stem should be fully opened with fresh pollen and be free from blemish.
18. Bud to Full Bloom: Bud to full bloom represents a rose of the same cultivar at four stages of its development and shall consist of four stems and shown as designated HT, Miniature, Miniflora or Grandiflora
19. Presentation: The exhibit should be gracefully balanced for size, height, width and colour combination. The flowers and foliage should be artistically arranged to avoid either crushing or excessive gaps and without exposing such expanses of stem or foliage that the flowers are not the dominant feature of the exhibit.
20. Old Garden Roses or Modern Roses (that cannot be displayed in other show classes): Toassist members in staging roses in the appropriate class the following list of roses is provided. If you are unsure of the class applicable to any of your roses please contact the Show Secretary who will assist. The most recent edition of Modern Roses will be used as the main reference in the resolution of any dispute or uncertainty. Roses bred after 1900 are Modern Roses.
21. Polyantha, Rambler, orSpecies Roses: e.g., The Fairy, China Doll, Honeyflow, Claret Cup, Carabella, Dorothy Perkins, Banksiae, R. Brunoli
22. Short-stem Cluster-flowered, Climber or Shrub Roses: Pillar Roses eg. Renae, Pinkie: Shrubs eg Dortmund, Berlin: Hybrid Musks
23. Short-stem Large-flowered Climber or Shrub Roses: eg. David Austin shrubs and any other form of modern rose in the old style
24. Old Garden Roses: Gallica, Centifolia, Moss, Damask, Bouralt, Alba, Hybrid Perpetual, Bourbon, Portland; China or Tea Roses: eg. Lady Hillingdon, Duchesse de Brabrant, Monsieur Tillier.
25. Information for Exhibitors: Staging and judging to be in accordance with the Rose Society of NSW Show Regulations as included.

## SHOW REGULATIONS Draft to be adopted by State Council - August 2019

Exhibits shall be judged in accordance with The National Rose Society of Australia's Rules of Judging and Standards as contained in the N.R.S.A. booklet "JUDGING ROSES" (A Handbook for Judges).

## APPENDIX 'E’ - SHOW REGULATIONS

This Appendix 'E' Show Regulations should be read in conjunction with the National Rose Society of Australia Inc. (NRSA) booklet Judging Roses, a Handbook for Judges, as revised 2013.

Local rules will take precedence over National rules.

## EXHIBITION ROSES

(These are roses registered as Hybrid Tea)

1. The award for Champion and Reserve Champion shall be selected from classes where roses are shown one bloom to a vase. An exhibition bloom has a high and pointed center.
2. Exhibition roses are shown singly, the presence of a bud or buds attached will disqualify.
3. Exhibition roses shall be shown in rows of three deep, where possible.

## BUNCH ROSES

(These are roses registered as Hybrid Tea)
4. Bunch classes shall be shown in single stems with no side buds and shall consist of not less than three stems of the same cultivar to a vase unless otherwise stated in the schedule.
5. A Bunch rose should have a good length of stem and good foliage, blooms should be uniform in size, half open and at an even stage of development. Petals are to be more upright and not pelleted out as in Exhibition roses.
6. Each vase shall be considered as a separate unit.

## DECORATIVE ROSES

(These are roses registered as Hybrid Tea, Climbing Hybrid Tea, Large Flowered Climber)
7. These are to be shown as follows:
(a) 3 stems and/or cuts to a vase of the same cultivar, any number of buds and/or blooms are allowed per cut. Buds or blooms may be at any stage of development.
(b) 4-6 stems and/or cuts to a vase of the same cultivar with a minimum of 10 blooms. Buds or blooms may be at any stage of development. The vase is to be marked with a sticker.
NOTE: Single Hybrid Tea roses may be shown in this classification. The winner is eligible for Champion
Vase of Decorative Roses 3 stems and/or cuts.

## BUD TO FULL BLOOM ROSES

(These are roses registered as Hybrid Tea)
8. Bud to Full Bloom is to represent a rose of the same cultivar at four stages of its development and shall consist of four stems.

\text { 1st Stage: } & \text { Bud to show colour, petals not starting to unfurl, sepals to be disregarded. } \\
\text { 2nd Stage: } & \text { Midway between 1st and 3rd stage. } \\
\text { 3rd Stage: } & \text { Bloom to be half open with a pointed center and layered. } \\
\text { 4th Stage: } & \text { Fully open bloom. Stamens of the rose to be fresh and visible. }
\end{array}
$$

## FULL BLOOM ROSES

(These are roses registered as Hybrid Tea, Clg Hybrid Tea, Large Flowered Climber, Grandiflora, Clg Grandiflora, or Shrub)
9. Full Bloom roses should be fully open, free from blemish and clearly show stamens with fresh pollen visible. These are to be shown as follows:
(a) 3 stems to a vase of the same cultivar unless otherwise stated in the schedule.

## GRANDIFLORA ROSES

(These are roses registered as Grandiflora or Clg Grandiflora)
10. These are to be shown as follows:
(a) 1 Vase of Grandiflora roses 1-6 cuts/stems roses.
(b) Bud to Full Bloom- Bud to Full Bloom is to represent a rose of the same cultivar at four stages of its development and shall consist of four stems.
(c) Full Bloom 3 stems to a vase of the same cultivar unless otherwise stated in the schedule.

NOTE: The winner of this class is to be judged against Grandiflora Roses exhibited in other classes to determine Champion Grandiflora.

## SINGLE ROSES

(These are roses registered as Hybrid Tea, Clg Hybrid Tea, Large Flowered Climber, Grandiflora, Clg Grandiflora, Floribunda, Clg Floribunda or Shrub)
11. A single rose has a single row of 5 petals but may have up to 3 additional petals in a second row. These are to be shown as follows:
(a) 3 stems and/or cuts of the same cultivar.
(b) 1 stem or cut

## FLORIBUNDA ROSES

(These are roses registered as Floribunda or Climbing Floribunda)
12. These are to be shown as follows:
(a) 1-6 stems and/or cuts, same cultivar, minimum of 10 blooms per vase. The vase is to be marked with a sticker.
(b) Up to 25 blooms, same cultivar, unlimited number of stems per vase.

## SHRUB ROSES

(These are roses registered as Shrub)
13. These are to be shown as follows:
(a) 1-6 stems and/or cuts to a vase, same cultivar, unlimited blooms.

## MINIFLORA ROSES

(These are roses registered as Miniflora or Climbing Miniflora)
14. These are to be shown as follows:
(a) 4-6 stems and/or cuts, same cultivar, minimum of 10 blooms. The vase is to be marked with a sticker.
(b) 3 stems and/or cuts of the same cultivar per vase irrespective of the number of blooms on each cut unless otherwise stated in the schedule.
(c) 5 stems, same cultivar, displaying Bunch form.
(d) Bud to Full Bloom, 4 stages, same cultivar.
(e) 3 stems, Full Bloom, same cultivar

Classes for 5 stems displaying Bunch form, Bud to Full Bloom and Full Bloom units shall be judged in accordance with the requirements of Hybrid Tea roses.

## MINIATURE ROSES

(These are roses registered as Miniature or Climbing Miniature)
15. These are to be shown as follows:
(a) 3 stems and/or cuts of the same cultivar per vase irrespective of the number of blooms on each cut unless otherwise stated in the schedule.
(b) 4-6 stems and/or cuts of the same cultivar, minimum of 10 blooms per vase. The vase is to be marked with a sticker.
(c) 5 stems, same cultivar, displaying Bunch form.
(d) Bud to Full Bloom, 4 stages, same cultivar.
(e) 3 stems, Full Bloom, same cultivar

Classes for 5 stems displaying Bunch form, Bud to Full Bloom and Full Bloom units shall be judged in accordance with the requirements for Hybrid Tea roses.

## POTTED MINIATURES

16. Pot size is specified as up to 200 mm ( 8 inches). Plants will be judged as follows:


## 13 GENERAL

17. A unit shall consist of one vase. An exhibit shall consist of one or more units.
18. Tied stems in a multi-stemmed unit are not permitted. The unit will be disqualified.
19. One point will be deducted for each and every pellet left in the exhibit; 3 or more pellets will disqualify the exhibit irrespective of whether the 3 or more pellets are found in one or more units within an exhibit. With classes comprising a number of units within the exhibit then it follows that no unit within that exhibit shall be eligible for an award if the rules have been infringed in any way. Units within a multiple unit exhibit that are found to have a pellet are not eligible for a Champion award.
20. It shall be the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that the number of stems or cuts at the top of the container can be counted by the judge and are not obscured by the packing material.
21. Wiring is not permitted.
22. Oasis may be used as a packing material provided that:
(a) it is provided by the exhibitor at no cost to the Society, and
(b) that it does not protrude above the top of the container.
23. A bud is the unexpanded stage of a rose flower with no petals unfurling. In the Bud to Full Bloom exhibit, colour must be showing.
24. Bowls provided by the Society shall be 10 cm florist bowls for Miniature roses and 15 cm florist bowls for others. They shall contain a mini-block of Oasis. Any offending unit shall be disqualified. Bowl exhibits shall be allowed a space of 30 cm overall diameter. Arrangements can contain buds, foliage and heps (if desired), and will be viewed all round. Bowls are judged as follows:

| Condition 3 points | Overall Beauty 3 points |
| :--- | :--- |
| Presentation2 points | Foliage 2 points |

25. All roses exhibited in a competition shall be from plants that have been grown by the exhibitor for at least three months immediately preceding the competition.
26. All Society members of the one residence and the children of that residence must exhibit at the grade of the highest graded Society member of that residence.
27. Exhibitors shall permit such persons as may be appointed by the Committee to view their gardens either prior to or after any show.
28. Exhibits must not be sprayed after being placed on the show bench nor may they be removed or replaced without permission of the Chief Steward/Show Manager.
29. A classified exhibitor may give verbal advice to another exhibitor but shall not physically assist in the preparation or staging of any exhibit other than his or her own.
30. Standard containers for all cultural classes will be provided and they, or the same type, must be used. If not used, the unit will be disqualified, unless otherwise stated in the schedule.
31. If an exhibitor is unable to stage his or her roses for any reason, permission may be given for an exhibitor of the same grade to stage on his or her behalf.
32. Appeals from exhibitors can be lodged free of charge to the Chairman of Judges of the days within one hour after completion of judging.

## CLASSIFICATIONS

33. For the purpose of exhibiting roses, a rose shall be judged according to the classification given to it in the latest version of Modern Roses. In the event of a rose being unclassified the Judges Panel of the Rose Society of NSW Inc. shall make recommendations to State Council as to where they feel that rose is most appropriately placed. If you are not sure of the classification of your rose and it is not on this list please contact me - Glynis -nbmhregional@gmail.com and I will endeavour find its correct classification.
These are the classification of the Registered Roses in Modern Roses that we use for Judging Classes. Please note that if you put the incorrect rose in a Class you will be disqualified.
